David Perkins

David Perkins is a Senior Professor of Education at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. He was a founding member of Project Zero, a research and development group, co-directed it for almost 30 years, and now serves as senior co-director and a member of its steering committee. His most recent book is *Making Learning Whole: How Seven Principles of Teaching can Transform Education* (Jossey-Bass, 2008). He has also authored *King Arthur's Round Table: How Collaborative Organisations Create Smart Organisations* (Wiley, 2003), *The Eureka Effect* (Norton, 2001), *Outsmarting IQ on intelligence and its cultivation* (The Free Press, 1995), *Knowledge as Design on teaching and learning for understanding* (Erlbaum, 1986), *The Intelligent Eye on learning to think through the arts* (Getty, 1994), and several other books, as



well as many articles. He has also helped develop instructional programs and approaches for teaching understanding and thinking, including initiatives in South Africa, Latin America, Israel, Australia and Sweden. He is a former Guggenheim fellow.

Ron Ritchhart

Ron Ritchhart is a Research Associate at Harvard Project Zero where his work centres on the understanding and development of instructional environments that encourage students' intelligence, understanding, creativity and mindfulness. He currently directs the Cultures of Thinking research project. Before coming to Project Zero, Ron taught elementary and middle school for 14 years, receiving the Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics Teaching. Ron has authored numerous books and articles as well as directed videos that explore how teachers foster understanding, nurture creativity, and make thinking visible. Major works include *Intellectual Character*, *The Creative Classroom Series*, and *Visible Thinking: Pictures of Practice*.



Mark Church

Mark Church was a teacher in both elementary and middle schools for thirteen years. His experiences have included teaching positions in the United States, Japan, Germany, and the Netherlands while being a workshop leader and presenting instructor at various conferences and institutes around the world. While in the classroom, Mark put into practice Harvard Project Zero research including both *Teaching for Understanding and Visible Thinking*. Now Mark is the Learning, Assessment, and Instructional Resource Supervisor for the Traverse City Area Public Schools in Michigan – helping to establish and support core reflective groups of teachers and school leaders in their efforts to create more meaningful opportunities for thinking and learning in their classrooms and schools. Mark is also a consultant to the Cultures of Thinking project.
